Check-in will be assigned by appointment only. All entries must be completed online. No walk-up or day-of entries will be accepted.



#### JUDGING & AWARDS

Judging will be completed by competent judges. Competition is open to everyone and all entries will be judged as open class (except classes which specify an age of the exhibitor and may or may not receive an award according to judges.) Decision of the judges is final.

Everyone, except department chairs and the assistants, must leave Floral Hall while entries are being judged and will not be permitted to re-enter until judging has been completed.

AN EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER ONLY ONE ITEM IN A CLASS AND MUST BE MADE BY THE PERSON EXHIBITING, OR IT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED. If more than one item is entered, all but one will be disqualified; the choice will be made by the department chair.

A tag will be firmly attached to each entry with the exhibitor number and name.

NO EXHIBIT WHICH RECEIVED A BLUE RIBBON IN ANY PREVIOUS MERCER COUNTY FAIR IN OPEN CLASS FLORAL HALL WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR COMPETITION THIS YEAR

Judges and Best of Show Awards: These awards will be presented to the most outstanding entry. In case of a tie, rosettes will be dually displayed.

**Premiums offered**: Blue ribbons receive \$5, Red ribbons receive \$3, and White ribbons receive \$1.

Sweepstakes scoring: Each Blue ribbon received in a category will count 5 points, Red will count 3 points and White will count 1 point. The exhibitor with the most points in a Department will be the sweepstakes winner for that Department. In the event of a tie, the rosette will be dually displayed.

**Grade Categories**: Exhibiting in graded categories requires the exhibitor to state grade in school just completed on the tag; failure to do so may result in disqualification.

**Removal of Entries**: All entries must be removed by the designated time and premiums will be paid at that time.

#### EXHIBIT PROTECTION

Every effort will be made by the Extension Homemakers and Fair Association to protect all exhibits from casualties. However, the Homemakers nor the Fair

Association will be responsible for any loss as a result of breakage, damage by handling, water, dirt, or loss by theft and/or other casualties.

When Floral is open, an official will be on duty. When closed the exhibit area will be locked and secure. Strenuous effort will be made to give the utmost protection to all exhibits.

#### SPECIAL AWARDS

All entries will count toward a Special Club Award. Any organized club will be eligible for participation (this includes church groups and local civic auxiliaries). The exhibitor must declare, at the time of registration, the club or organization to whose credit the points shall be awarded. The exhibitor must be a member of that club or organization. Each entry will count two points, each Blue ribbon will count 5 points, each Red ribbon will count 3 points, and each White ribbon will count 1 point.

Scrapbook pages must be in a binder (binder not judged).

#### CANNING

Sweepstakes: Rosette Best of Show: Rosette

Canning will be judged first on appropriate headspace, then appearance of the pack, preparation, selection of canned products, and on the container. Standard mason type jars only. Commercially canned products will be disqualified. All jars must be sealed. Jars may be opened for judging. Exhibitors are urged to consult USDA guidelines (nchfp.uga.edu) to make certain jar is filled to within appropriate headspace. A label is required for all entries to identify the name of the product and date processed. Exhibitors are encouraged to specify processing method and time. Collections must be in a box for easier handling.

#### CHILDREN'S

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

If an entry has more than one piece or several items, attach the pieces together, have them in a box or on a display board. They must be suitably displayed to be entered as an exhibit. All work must be done by the exhibitor. "Ceramic" may also include resin and plaster crafts. STATE GRADE JUST COMPLETED ON TAG. Items must be clean and completed within past 2 years.

# **CULINARY**

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

Baked foods will be judged on these points: appearance (inside and outside), texture, aroma, and then taste. Food entries must be in covered containers. Please do not put napkins or doilies under the food. Children should specify grade just completed on back of their tags. No duplication of entries, e.g. cannot enter same cookies in both open and children's class.

# BEES & HONEY

Honey should be submitted in 1 lb. Queen Line jars, no decorative covers or labels (no honey bear containers of any kind allowed). Classes assigned at Judge's discretion.

#### GARDEN PRODUCE

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

All exhibits must be raised in home garden or orchard. Judged on uniformity and freedom of defects with stems attached. Open to all youth and adults. Only one member of a family is eligible for an award in any one class. ITEMS MUST BE DISPLAYED IN STURDY CONTAINERS, such as aluminum pie plates, or very heavy paper plates. If an entry is small and lightweight, use a smaller plate. We reserve the right to dispose of over ripe or spoiled produce after judging.

#### FLOWER & PLANT

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

An exhibitor may have only one entry per class. Suitable containers are required for showing cut flowers, but do not affect the judging. Containers shown in arrangements are considered in the judging. Plastic household commercial product containers (bleach, etc.) are not acceptable. Exceptions are noted. Label plant name for the classes with miscellaneous, any variety, or any other not listed. There are to be no leaves or blooms down in the vase.

# **NEEDLEWORK**

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

If an entry has more than one piece (or several items) attach pieces together or have them in a box or on a display board. They must be suitably displayed to be entered as an exhibit. Pictures are measured by images only, not by mats or frames. Items must be clean and completed within the past 2 years.

#### CROCHET & KNIT

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

If an entry has more than one piece (or several items) attach pieces together or have them in a box or on a display board. Items must be suitably displayed to be entered as an exhibit. Items should be clean and completed within the past 2 years.

#### QUILT

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

Items must be clean and completed within past 2 years. Specify persons piecing and quilting entry.

#### SEWING

Sweepstakes - Rosette Best of Show - Rosette

Current styles and fashion trends will be considered by judges when awarding premiums. Judges can disqualify old (out-of-style) garments. Exhibitor needs to provide hanger. Items must be clean and completed within past 2 years. NO knit or crochet items.

### HOMECRAFT & FURNISHING

If an entry has more than one piece or several items, attach the pieces together, have them in a box or on a display board. They must be suitably displayed to be entered as an exhibit. 

# CANNING

Canning will be judged first on appropriate headspace, then appearance of the pack, preparation, selection of canned products, and on the container. Standard mason type jars only. Commercially canned products will be disqualified. All jars must be sealed. Jars may be opened for judging. Exhibitors are urged to consult USDA guidelines (nchfp.uga.edu) to make certain jar is filled to within appropriate headspace. A label is required for all entries to identify the name of the product and date processed, specify processing method and time. Collections must be in a box for easier handling.



Controlling headspace: The unfilled space above the food in a jar and below its lid is termed headspace. Directions for canning specify leaving 1/4-inch for jams and jellies, 1/2-inch for fruits and tomatoes to be processed in boiling water, and from 1- to 1-1/4-inches in low acid foods to be processed in a pressure canner. This space is needed for expansion of food as jars are processed, and for forming vacuums in cooled jars. The extent of expansion is determined by the air content in the food and by the processing temperature. Air expands greatly when heated to high temperatures; the higher the temperature, the greater the expansion. Foods expand less than air when heated. (SOURCE: USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning)
